#### Feedback doctoral students/Covid-19 pandemic

The office's work was marked heavily by the Covid-19 pandemic in the last few months. Doctoral students, too, are facing unique challenges; it is primarily these points that trouble them in these times (from feedback to the survey in the April Newsletter):

- Child care and home office
- · Access to libraries/archives/LSG
- Loss of jobs (outside the university) and mandates (freelancers)
- · Psychic strain

#### Office

Since May, Sabine Karger works in the office's secretariat.

Project: Digitalisation of acceptance as doctoral student and registration with the GSGG:

- Daily life aspect: avoidance of redundancies for new doctoral students (no need to hand into the GSGG what has already been handed into the examination office), automatization of administrative work within the GSGG.
- University politics: Part of the university wide implementation of the University Statistics Law: Science politics and university research want data on doctoral studies (as well as on BA and MA studies), which were collected by hand so far and will be available superiorly edited.

Currently, registrations are dropping; possible reasons are the challenges of the advanced semester, teaching commitment and oversaturation due to numerous online events.

The **Hetairos programme** won't be taking place in the winter semester 2020/21. No predictions can be made regarding the future development.




## 4. Grants and allowances

- Allowances for conference and research trips: Currently suspended due to the pandemic; decision on opening the line of funding on July 10
- More pandemic compatible lines of funding in preparation, further information thereon after the board meeting on July 10

Since March, **business trips** have been generally prohibited by the university administration, the respective **GSGG funding lines** (grants for conference and research trips) have therefore been suspended. A refund of cancellation fees for already granted allowances for trips was possible on short notice.

The GSGG is currently conceiving of **pandemic compatible funding lines**, which will be discussed during the next board meeting.



The **funding volume** dropped continuously over the last years. That is primarily due to a more restrictive granting of completion grants; allowances for trips and self-organised events will continue to be funded to their usual extent.



# 5. Prospects

- As in the previous year: No fundamental strategical decisions until the realignment of the university management
- Day of the GSGG: November 5 2020, this year without the insights into the Humanities, but as always with the Christian-Gottlob-Heyne award

Since the end of 2019, the university has been headed by **provisional president** Prof. Dr. Reinhard Jahn. Trend-setting decisions will only be made with a new administration – there is currently no call for a new president.

The **Day of the GSGG** on November 5 will take place this year without the insights into the humanities, the **Christian-Gottlob-Heyne-Award** will also be awarded this year. The preparations occur two-pronged (presence/online).
