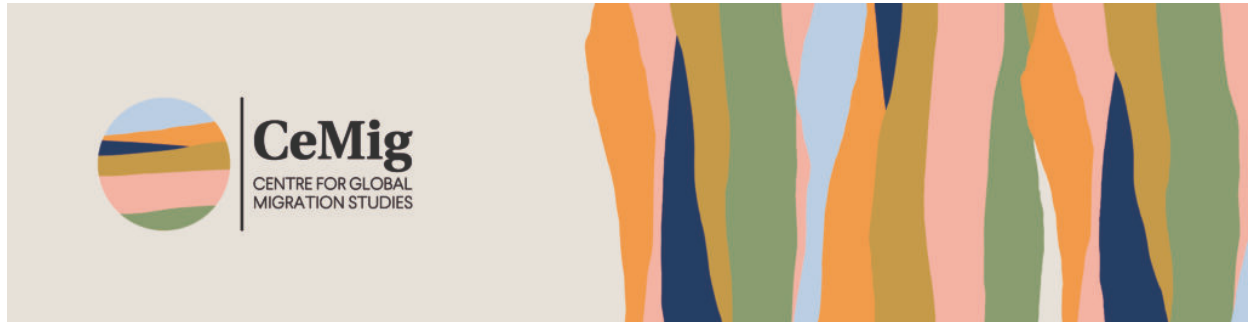

Abstract: "This paper compiles and analyzes eight decades of regularization programs for undocumented immigrants in OECD countries using a newly constructed dataset, RegMig, which systematically documents the key features of these policy programs. The database provides detailed information on each program, including the implementing country, the year applications were filed, eligible nationalities, announcement dates, the duration of the registration window, the minimum required period of prior irregular residence, the number of beneficiaries, and the type of regularization program. RegMig identifies 159 programs implemented between 1945 and 2024, benefiting at least 17.93 million undocumented migrants. The paper contributes to the literature by offering the first comprehensive and comparative overview of the design, scope, and evolution of

regularization programs across OECD countries. A case study focusing on Spain further illustrates the historical trajectory and policy dynamics underlying regularization efforts."
