GGG's Support Measures

The Göttingen Graduate School of Social Sciences provides support measures and scholarships for PhD students of social sciences. Further up-to-date information can be found on the GGG homepage. The following funding options are available in the upcoming months:

Family Oriented Completion Grant

- for PhD students caring for children or relatives in need of care and thus needing more time to complete their PhD thesis

Pathways into Science Management

In 2024, Göttingen's graduate schools face very scarce human resources. Therefore, we would not be able to deliver a full WeWiMento program with appropriate attention. We consequently have to pause WeWiMento in 2024 and will not announce seats for the mentoring program in the beginning of 2024. Hopefully, WeWiMento will restart - maybe in new shape - in 2025, when vacancies and parental leaves will have cancelled out. Despite these limitations we will offer another introductory workshop (Schnupperworkshop) in 2024. Time and place will be announced in the Qualification Portal for PhD students. SOEP is the German Socio-Economic Panel Study is a representative panel study for the German population, collecting data on a broad variety of topics of everyday life, including general wellbeing, household composition, educational aspirations and educational status, income and occupational biographies, leisure time activities, housing, health, political orientation and more. With its long running panel structure, the breadth of topics and the representative nature of the data, the SOEP has become a central resources for quantitative research in the social sciences in The workshop series are digital (i.e. everyone gets a place), free of

charge and offered again and again (several times a year). Sometimes the workshops consist of only three sessions, sometimes it is much more extensive. Further information can be found here.
