

Information sheet Panthéon-Assas

Bonjour Madame Mann,

Greetings from Paris!

The nomination period for **exchange programmes** is approaching. This year, it will take place from **15 March to 15 May 2026**, you will receive all the necessary information by email!

Here are some useful basic but essential information for you as a incoming student:

Before the nomination :

- For any questions prior to their nomination, students should contact the relevant people at their home institution. Panthéon-Assas becomes the main point of contact once the students' nominations have been accepted by our department.

Courses :

- Exchange students will have to choose courses **within their field of nomination** (law, economics, management, information and communication). We allow them to choose **only one course** in another field of study.
- We allow students to take courses in **all years of study**, including master's degrees. However, please note that some courses have prerequisites. For master's courses in particular, especially when selected by undergraduate students, it is strongly recommended that you already have a basic understanding of the subject matter.
- The **timetables** are updated before each semester, however changes can occur within the first few weeks of class (times and availability). - We are offering **courses in English for a limited number of ECTS**, students must pay attention to this when considering applying to our university.
- Students must be aware some courses can be hard to follow, they must be certain their **language skills** (French and/or English) allow them to feel comfortable.
- **Several situations need to be considered in advance**: scheduling conflicts between two courses; courses may not be accepted by your university's faculty when signing the learning agreement; prerequisites may be required for certain courses, especially at the master's level. For all these reasons, the range of courses offered in English may be more limited than expected. In order for students to obtain 30 credits, they may have to take courses in French (up to 4.5 credits). French course credits are not always recognise, it is advisable to have a level of French that allows students to take courses in French if necessary (minimum B2).

Transcript of records :

- **Grades** are usually published at the end of February for the first semester and in mid-June for the second semester. The exact dates are announced a few days before the publication.

- Transcripts are sent to students and their universities **within two months** of the date the grades are published. **This information is very important, and students must take this timetable into account when choosing their mobility options.**
- The publication of grades is **independent from our department**, and the date is the same for all students at the university. No grades may be communicated prior to the official publication date
