

## **Public International Law II**

### Learning objectives/skills:

After successfully completing the module 'Public International Law II', students

- have acquired in-depth knowledge of general international law;
- are particularly familiar with
  - the law of the United Nations and its main organs
  - the mechanisms for the implementation of international law
- have acquired the necessary knowledge in state responsibility, enforcement and the peaceful resolution of international legal disputes;
- have acquired basic knowledge in specialized areas of international law; these may include in particular:
  - international human rights protection
  - international humanitarian law and international criminal law
  - international environmental law, in particular climate change law
  - law of the sea
- are able to apply the knowledge they have acquired to resolve relevant international law cases and critically examine the legal issues raised.

- master the relevant methodological principles, and
- can systematically analyse a case of international law and resolve it in a reasonable manner.
