

# Information for Students of the Double Degree Programme in Development Economics in Cooperation with Universita degli Studi di Firenze (University of Florence), Italy Home University: University of Florence

#### I. Description of the double degree programme

The two-year English-language double degree master's programme in development economics is jointly offered by the University of Florence and the University of Göttingen. The programme is a partnership that offers students the opportunity to earn both a Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Development Economics offered by the Faculty of Business and Economics, University of Göttingen; and a Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Economics and Development offered by the School of Economics and Management of the University of Florence.

The programme is research-oriented, and combines the fields of applied development economics with a strong emphasis on quantitative methods with modules in international economics, international business and law. The programme is designed to prepare graduates to think analytically, and to equip them with cutting-edge research techniques, as well as in-depth knowledge of the driving forces behind economic development.

#### **Degree summary**

- The MSc in Economics and Development comprises advanced study in macro- and microeconomic theory, applied
  economics, and policy analysis. Moreover, special emphasis is placed on research methodology and econometric
  analysis. Within the curriculum participants get also acquainted with relevant aspects of international law and
  governance.
- The MSc in Development Economics is the only university-level master's programme in development economics in Germany. The University of Göttingen hosts Germany's largest internationally visible concentration of development economics researchers. The wide course offerings in the field of development economics (for which special attention is placed on quantitative methods) allow students to specialize in their specific area of interest.

Participants of the double degree programme complete two semesters at the University of Florence, and two semesters at the University of Göttingen.

Upon completion of the 120 ECTS (credit) programme, and having satisfied all the graduation requirements of both universities, participants will receive two separate and nationally recognised master's degree certificates: a Master of Science in Economic and Development, awarded by the University of Florence and a Master of Science in Development Economics, awarded by the University of Göttingen. Both certificates state that the degree is awarded within a joint programme and indicate that the respective certificates are valid only in conjunction with the other certificate. The double degree programme enables participating students to complete two degrees within four semesters (normally requiring four years).



#### II. Curriculum for students from the University of Florence

The double degree programme begins in the winter semester every year.

#### Semester 1 and 2

In the first semester (winter semester), participants commence their studies in Florence and continue their second semester in Florence where they complete mandatory and elective courses for the MSc in Economics and Development. At the end of their second semester, students travel to Göttingen and enrol there as well for their third and fourth semester. Students with home university Florence have to be enrolled at the University of Florence for the whole duration of the programme (four semesters).

#### Semesters 3 and 4

From October to August, participants spend two semesters in Göttingen, and complete the course requirements for the M.Sc. Development Economics and write their master's thesis under the regulations of the University of Göttingen. The master's thesis comprises 30 ECTS and will be written under the supervision of professors from the University of Göttingen. The thesis will apply towards both degrees as part of the double degree programme. The courses and the master's thesis will be fully recognized as the study abroad component for the M.Sc. in Economics and Development.

#### **Programme structure**

1. Participants have to spend the first two semesters of the first year (academic year: September-July/August) at the University of Florence.

During the first two semesters at the University of Florence students have to pass courses in the scope of 60 Credits according to the following regulations:
