•	The obligatory copies must be submitted to the examination office <b>within two years of paramination</b> . If the doctoral candidate fails to meet this deadline, all rights acquired throub become void. The doctoral committee can extend the deadline for submission, but by no two years. ٠	The obligatory copies should be provided with a <b>title page</b> , that should be designed accorr in appendix IV PromO. The thesis should be followed by a short <b>c.v.</b> that depicts the scientific of the doctoral candidate besides details about date and place of birth, nationality and durat one of the universities according to the sequence of their attendance. 	<ul> <li>Once the doctoral candidate has satisfied all obligations as defined under these regulations, in particular, submission of the obligatory copies, the examination office shall conclude the doctoral studies by awarding the doctoral certificate (§ 25 I 1 PromO) The doctoral title may not be used unless the obligatory copies of the doctoral thesis have been submitted. The title "Dr. des." must not be used. (§ 25 III PromO)</li> </ul>		
Early completion of the doctoral studies based on a publication contract			
	<ul> <li>Should there be an important reason and upon joint application of the doctoral candidate and his or her first academic advisor, publication may be managed initially in the manner that only an abstract is made publicly available for a certain period and not the complete thesis manuscript. An important reason shall apply in particular if         <ul> <li>a) parts of the thesis were accepted for publication in a journal or a publishing house and prior publication of</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>these parts is inadmissible according to the underlying contract, or</li> <li>b) this is required for the protection of intellectual property, as otherwise the application for property rights would be in jeopardy, the publication depends on the consent of third parties, or scientific data directly connected with the dissertation should first be published in another way. (§ 24 VIII 1-2 PromO)</li> </ul>		
	• The period during which only an abstract is publicly available ends <b>one year after the date of the passed oral</b> <b>examination</b> . The examination board decides on the existence of an important reason. The application must be made before the date of the oral examination. A further extension may be granted once for a maximum of one additional year; the doctoral committee shall decide on this upon application; the application for extension may only be submitted if the certificate of revision is presented at the same time. The obligatory copies must be submitted by the end of the approved period at the latest. (§ 24 VIII 3-7 PromO)		
	<ul> <li>The doctorate may be awarded before the obligatory copies are submitted if <ul> <li>a publishing contract with an academic publisher is submitted in place of the obligatory copies and the publisher also declares in writing that printing and delivery of the obligatory copies are guaranteed within a period of no more than one year (in exceptional cases upon approval by the doctoral committee: two years) since the oral examination, or another important reason according to § 24 VIII 2 PromO (existence of an important reason, see above) has been proven, and</li> <li>b) a publication according to § 24 VIII PromO (abstract) is made. (§ 25 II 1 PromO)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>In that case, the completion of the doctoral studies is subject to reservations. (§ 25 II 2 PromO) The obligatory copies (as per § 24 V 1 PromO) must be submitted by the end of the approved period at the latest. (§ 24 VIII 3 PromO)</li> </ul>		
	• If this obligation is <b>violated</b> , all rights acquired through the examination, especially the right to carry the doctoral degree, become void. In this case the doctoral certificate shall be returned immediately. However, before the deadline as set forth in § 24 V 2 and 4 PromO expires, the doctoral candidate again has the opportunity to fulfill the requirements for awarding the doctoral degree; otherwise all rights acquired through the examination, especially the right to carry the doctoral degree, shall expire. (§ 25 II 3-5 PromO)
