

## Informationen for Students of the Double Degree Programme in Development Economics in Cooperation with Stellenbosch University, South Africa

## I. Profile of the Double Degree Programme (120 ECTS)

The two-year double degree master's programme in development economics is jointly offered by Stellenbosch University and the University of Göttingen. The programme is a partnership that offers students the opportunity to earn both a Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Development Economics offered by the Faculty of Business and Economics, University of Göttingen, and a Master of Commerce (MCom) in Economics offered by the Department of Economics at Stellenbosch University. Stellenbosch University is one of the leading universities in South Africa and known for its high quality post graduate programmes in economics.

The joint curriculum is a unique combination of the different foci in teaching and research in development economics at both universities. The master's programme in development economics in Göttingen offers research oriented courses with a strong focus on quantitative methods. At Stellenbosch University participants will be offered a broad range of courses with an emphasis on case studies and the analysis of the economic and socio-economic situation in South Africa.

Participants of the Double Degree Programme spend their first semester at the University of Göttingen before leaving to study at Stellenbosch University for their second and third semester. Students will then return to Göttingen to complete their studies in their forth semester. Participants have the choice to write their master's thesis either at Stellenbosch University or at the University of Göttingen.

Upon completion of the 120 ECTS (credit) of the programme, and having satisfied all the graduation requirements of both universities, participants will receive two separate and nationally recognised master's degree certificates: a Master of Commerce in Economics, awarded by Stellenbosch University and a Master of Science in Development Economics, awarded by the University of Göttingen. Both certificates state that the degree is awarded within a joint programme and indicate that the respective certificates are valid only in conjunction with the other certificate. The double degree programme enables participating students to complete two degrees within four semesters (normally requiring three years, since the Stellenbosch programme is a one year master's programme and the Göttingen programme is a two year master's programme).

Language of instruction in both universities is English.



## II. Curriculum for Students with Home University Göttingen

The doube degree programme starts in the winter semester, so application is not possible for the summer semester. Due to a different start of the academic year (October in Göttingen and February in Stellenbosch) and hence different lecture periods in the partner universities the double degree programme has a special structure and time schedule.

Participants spend their first semester (winter semester, starting October) at the University of Göttingenin, taking primarily the mandatory courses in the M.Sc. Development Economics programme.

At the end of January participants leave for Stellenbosch/ South Africa. In case participants have to take exams for their first semester mandatory courses in Feburary, they can do so while they are in Stellenbosch, writing their exams at the same time as their fellow students in Göttingen.

From end of January until end of November students spend their second and third semester in Stellenbosch, taking the mandatory courses and electives of the MCom in Economics Programme at Stellenbosch University. The courses from Stellenbosch University will be acknowledged as part of the M.Sc. in Development Economics Programme at the University of Göttingen.

The fourth and last semester (summer semester) will be spent at the University of Göttingen. Participants will be given the opportunity to specialize in various fields of develoment economics and to do so they can choose among a broad range of electives in agricultural economics, global health, behavioural development economics and other prominent fields of development economics.

In between the end of semester in Stellenbosch (end of November) and the beginning of the lecture period at the University of Göttingen (April) participants are expected to write their 17-week master's thesis. Participants can choose whether they want to stay at Stellenbosch University or return to Göttingen for their master thesis. Participants earn 30 credits for their master thesis. They can choose a first supervisor either from Stellenbosch University or from the University of Göttingen. The choice of first supervisor determines the examinarion regulations for the master's thesis. Students who choose their first supervisor from the University of Göttingen do not have an oral defence of their master's thesis. The second supervisor has to be choosen from the partner university. The cooordinators from both partner universities will support the participants in finding suitable supervisors for their favorite master's thesis topic. The master's thesis will be acknowledged as master's thesis for both degrees of the Double Degree Programme.

## 3. Master's Thesis (Göttingen or Stellenbosch)

It is recommended to write the master's thesis in the period in between the ending of the lecture period in Stellenbosch and the beginning of the lecture period in Göttingen (December to March). Participants can choose to spend this period either in Stellenbosch or Göttingen depending on their choice of first thesis' supervisor. The master's thesis will earn participants 30 credits. The thesis regulations of the first supervisor's home university apply. The master's thesis will be recognized for the master's programme of the partner university.

## 4. Specialization (Göttingen)

Participants specialize in their favorite field of interest in development economics during their forth semester in Göttingen. Participants have to pass 30 credits according to the following regulations:

### III. Study Organization

#### **Enrolment:**

Participants are enrolled at the University of Göttingen during the entire double degree programme (4 semesters). The admission letter will include all necessary information on the enrolment procedure. If you are an international student and have questions concerning the enrolment procedure at the University of Göttingen please contact Ms Wahdat (international.study@uni-goettingen.de). Before starting your study abroad period at Stellenbosch University you have to enroll additionally at Stellenbosch University. The study abroad advisors at the Faculty of Business and Economics in Göttingen (auslandsstudium@wiwi.uni-goettingen.de) and the Postgraduate and International Office in Stellenbosch are happy to share all necessary information on the enrolment procedure in Stellenbosch with you and will support you in all questions concerning the visa application procedure for South Africa.

#### Semester fees:

There is no tuition fee for either national or international students at the University o Göttingen. While studying at the University of Göttingen during their first and fourth semester participants pay



semester fees in göttingen (ca. 390 Euro per semester). Semester fees include free local bus rides in Göttingen and a free railway ticket for Lower Saxony as well as a culture ticket with free or nearly free access to lots of local cultural and sport events and subsidized meals in the students' canteens. While studying in Stellenbosch (second and third semester) participants are enrolled at the University of Göttingen but pay only the adminstration fee (75 Euro per semester). Participants do not pay tuition fees at Stellenbosch Univetsity but a servcie and adminstration fee for exchange students (ca. 4750 Rand per academic year or ca. 230 Euro per semester).

## Visa application:

Participants will receive an admission letter via email from the International Office of Stellenbosch University. This document enables you to apply for a student's visa at the Embassy of South Africa.

## Funding Stay Abroad period at Stellenbosch University:

The University of Göttingen is happy to offer its three best participants of the double degree programme a grant from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). The stipend is granted within the DAAD International Double Degree Funding Programme and includes travel costs to South Africa, a subsidy for the mandatory health insurance and a non-repayable grant to cover the living expenses in South Africa (ca. 750 Euro per month). Participants who do not receive the DAAD funding may apply for PROMOS, another DAAD programme offered by the University of Göttingen, that will cover the living expenses in South Africa partly.
