Tasks:

Supporting several research projects on political radicalization (joint with the Hebrew University of Jerusalem) and the political economy of long-run development (joint with the University of St. Gallen and UC San Diego). The main activities include preparing structured and unstructured data from various sources, preliminary analysis of collected data (with the use of appropriate software), and providing support in the preparation of scientific papers and research reports.

Required profile:

- Enrolled (Bachelor or Master) student with a background in Economics, Political Science, or related areas
- Good or very good grades
- Fluency in French is desirable for one of the positions, fluency in English for the other position
- Interest in the field of (long-run) development and/or economic history
- Able to work independently and perform his/her tasks accurately and in a structured way
- Team spirit and flexibility
- Knowledge of statistics/econometrics
- Knowledge of standard PC software (mainly MS Office)
- Knowledge of statistical software packages (preferably Stata or R, and/or Python)

- An international work environment with project partners in Germany, Switzerland, Israel, and the United States
- Transferable skills (e.g., web scraping, automatic detection and processing of large volumes of printed text, and preparing geographic data for analysis)
