Applications/information on students nominated must reach our institution by:

**Autumn term** Nominations: 15<sup>th</sup> May Applications: 30<sup>th</sup> May

**Spring term** Nominations: 15<sup>th</sup> November Applications: 30<sup>th</sup> November

Following the receipt of the online application, AUTh will send its decision within 4-6 weeks.

# 2.3.3. Transcripts of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

# 2.3.4. Termination of Agreement

If one or both parties wish to terminate the agreement a notice period of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
