

According to the Faculty Council resolution of 06 July 2008, examiners must fulfil the following criteria in order to be allowed to evaluate Bachelor's theses:

„At least one of the two reviewers of a Bachelor's thesis must hold a doctorate. Non-doctoral graduates can regularly act as first reviewers if the supervised Bachelor's thesis is thematically linked to a course taught by them and evidently provides the opportunity to prepare students for a Bachelor's thesis. As a rule, a non-doctoral candidate should not supervise more than three Bachelor's theses in one semester, insofar as the staffing situation of the department allows this restriction. First and second supervisors should be in an employment relationship with the university, apl. professors and habilitated persons are exempt from this.“
